Dues Considerations

We are not proposing to raise dues at this time. However, given our recent pattern of slight decreases in yearly membership(due in part to our aging membership), we do not feel it prudent to reduce them.

Venue decisions will not affect expenses since we have not paid rent for the past few years. Stipends paid for room set-up at RSC were budgeted from savings this past year, and if the government allows us to meet in person in the future, we will have similar expenses wherever we meet.

We continue our infrastructure support for such items as website, office, mailing, and newsletter, etc. Although we can reduce expenses for refreshments and travel this year, we will be increasing our honoraria expenses due to our expanded Zoom lecture program.

Paying dues at the supporting level will be particularly advantageous this year because of the number of lectures scheduled.

The outward course of our lives has been changed in every respect since the spring of this year. Our interactions with other people have been challenged in significant ways. However, we can take strength and guidance through our relationship to Michael, the spirit of our age.

May our commitment for truth live in the face of all lies, our grounding in love bless a world struggling with hate, and our courage for good deeds overcome all fear and doubt.
